William Z. Martin Farm Auction, Railroad Ave. New Holland, PA

The Martin auction business began in the 1930's with William Z. Martin holding farm machinery and horse sales in New Holland, PA. In the early years the Martin Family was known for conducting some of the top Shetland and Welsh Pony sales and for buying and shipping by rail car and horse van many horses from horse auctions in primarily Kentucky, Indiana, Ohio back to Blue Ball and New Holland, PA. A Roy Rogers Palomino was proudly remembered being purchased through an early Martin auction held by William Z. Martin.

The Martin family auctioneers included, William Z. Martin, Paul Z. Martin, Sr., Larry L. Martin, Vernon Martin and Paul Z. Martin, Jr. Paul, Sr. and the three sons traveled all over the USA and Canada, New Zealand, Puerto Rico as Independent Auctioneers and bid spotters at premier horse sales of Canadian Standard-bred, Keeneland, Ocala Breeders sales and Tattersalls.

Shirley Martin Morgan was the Office Manager and Vice President at her retirement in 2010. Even though Shirley is "technically" retired, Martin Auctioneers is still yielding from the prosperity she helped build in the business. Many key people have helped carry out the 50 year success. Well known faces like Roger Spencer and Patrick Morgan, Auctioneers/bid spotters did many miles of trucking and setting up sales. Mac Gray, Fred York, the Rhode Island crew, the office staff and employees that added hard work, long hours and many miles to make a sale succeed, were a large part of the success shared by Martin's.

Passing through the auction ring in the past 50 years were some historically significant and sought after coaches, carriages, sleighs and accoutrements. Some being shipped all over the world. The JD Pemberton Collection in Toronto, Canada and Jack Seabrook Auction (NJ 1996) were a couple of the highest honors to conduct. Ther Pemberton Auction broke the record for the highest auction price for a Park Drag with Lamps selling for \$223,000, Holland & Holland "Commodore" Road Coach brought \$175,000. The Jack Seabrook Auction was a memorable auction as the "Nimrod" Road Coach by F & R Shanks brought \$190,000 and the "Tantivy" F & R Shanks brought \$210,000. Two Auctions held for Dinwiddie Lampton, Jr. part being from the Formerly known Coson Collection at Beechdale (PA & KY) and the Estate of Elizabeth Brown

Lampton (KY), H. Kauffman & Sons (NY 1996) were also very notable collections dispersed. Recent auctions yielding nice results were 2018 Carl Casper Carriage & Coach Auction, 2019 highlight was selling the Million Quiet Original Condition "Lightning" Road Coach for \$190,000 to a German Collection. Other extraordinary collections sold by Martin Auctioneers, Inc. were the first Carriage, Sleigh & Antique Liquidation of the Magee Transportation Museum, Bloomsburg, PA 1978 Ambrose Clark, Carriage & Harness Museum Cooperstown (NY), 1978 Silver Springs Florida Auction, 1980 Huckleberry Farm Collection Auction (NY) with the Peter Duchin Orchestra as Entertainment and Tempel Smith Collection, Libertyville, IL in Association with John Mauger, Thimbleby & Shoreland Auction House Reading, England.
